Letter From the President

Dear Greyhound Friends,

So here I am once again looking at my calendar and all that we have accomplished since I wrote the Spring letter which seems like such a short time ago. Within that short time, we have done A lot! We had another wildly successful Tricky Tray! Thank you, Maria. I was unable to be there as I was holding an adoption day at our kennel in south jersey which was able to be done on the same day because of the commitment of our volunteers in both locales. With Fall festivities quickly approaching we must take a minute to congratulate ourselves for another successful season and then forge ahead!

Our Fall festivities are designed to allow you and your family to enjoy the season! Let's get outside and enjoy the cooler weather. These events carry us all the way up to the holidays. Our events span the territory in our name, NJ (although we have branched out slightly over the years). We start in south Jersey with one of our staple annual events the Fall Picnic that will be happening Sunday September 16th at our Kennel in Tabernacle NJ. Also, on September 22nd (rain date 23rd) we remember Linda Jensen, a friend to racing greyhounds and adoptions, by participating in The Linda Jensen Memorial Picnic in Pomfret Connecticut on Fred Fulchino's Greyhound puppy farm. The Craft show will be held in central NJ, Westfield to be exact on November 10th and 11th. We see new and different ideas for fundraisers utilizing the technology, that now rules our world, and tap into that by having a tech savvy volunteer that sets up said fundraisers, for example the On the Road Again Sponsorship Program where you can sponsor a specific dog for transport via Facebook and our website GFNJ.org then see that dogs photo upon arrival. We have the Feed the Pups Program that is an online donation-based program that allows you to provide care and food for dogs in our award-winning prison program in which inmates are paired with dogs for further growth while they are incarcerated. How all of this happens is based on what you'll hear me implore often "Pay it Forward". Help after you've gained your furry friend and completed your family. Join us for some events and mingle among others who own greyhounds, there is a strong comradery there. Start a conversation, give some time to help others discover the joys of giving back. We are a community based in caring.

One additional note:

I feel it important that our adopters be informed about what is going on in the industry. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me. As you may know, most of our greyhounds are brought to GFNJ from Florida. What you may not know is that this spring a Constitutional Committee, that meets every 20 years, has proposed an amendment to the Florida constitution to band dog racing. It is called Amendment 13. Since then a Superior court judge has ruled that the amendment is unconstitutional. However, her decision will be appealed by the opposition and the state. This matter was to be voted on by Floridian voters in November. With this issue at a standstill we are hopeful that Amendment 13 is left off the ballot for if it was to pass we could expect an influx of dogs per the exodus and then none. Stay tuned for further developments.

Checking Under the Hood – Yearly and Routine Maintenance of Your Greyhound

Just like cars, air conditioners and people, dogs require regular maintenance. Yearly they should have a Wellness Exam to make sure that no new health issues have developed. You as an owner should be regularly checking their teeth, nails and ears and taking whatever steps are necessary to keep these in good condition.

YEARLY WELLNESS EXAM

A wellness exam's purpose is not to treat existing symptoms, but to ensure no illnesses are in their early stages to maintain your pet's good health.

Your dog's wellness exam consists of 4 principal parts:

1. **Pre-Examination** — When you schedule your dog's wellness examination, your vet might have special instructions, such as bringing in a urine or stool sample, or having your dog fast prior to the visit. She might also discuss with you your dog's general health, eating habits and other behaviors or signs of disease to help her prepare for the examination.

2. Your Conversation with the Veterinarian — When you take your dog in for his wellness exam, your vet will have important questions for you. For example, she will want to know about your dog's diet, how much exercise he gets, any unusual behaviors (such as excessive thirst or problems breathing), and whether his bowel movements and urination are normal.

3. **The Physical Examination** — Your vet will observe your dog's general appearance, listen to his heart and lungs (called "auscultation") and "palpate" (or feel) specific areas of his body. She will also want to see how he walks, whether he is alert, and whether he is overweight or underweight. She will check the condition of his coat and skin to see if either is unusually dry or oily, and whether there is the presence of dandruff or signs of excessive hair loss. Your vet will also check your dog's eyes, ears and mouth. She will want assurance that his eyes show no signs of redness or discharge, as well as whether there are abnormal lumps and any signs of cloudiness. She will also look for signs of discharge, thickening or hair loss around his ears, and check to see if his mouth and teeth are healthy, paying special attention to any signs of periodontal disease or ulcers around the mouth. Finally, your vet might perform routine wellness screening tests, including a CBC, or complete blood count, a biochemistry profile, urinalysis, thyroid hormone testing

4. Your Vet's Recommendations — Based on her conversation with you, your dog's medical history and the results of the physical examination, your vet will recommend any necessary preventive actions or medical treatments to ensure his or her continuing health. She might, for example, recommend changes to their diet, treatment for fleas, ticks or internal parasites and heartworms, and any special treatments needed to improve their skin, coat, eyes or teeth.

EARS

Every 2 to 4 weeks check your dog's ears – carefully. Dirt and wax can be removed by swabbing the **ears** with a cotton ball but don't **clean** further than you can see and never use a Q-tip.

If your pet is displaying any of the following you should consult a vet: brown, yellow, or bloody discharge; dog has swollen ear; odor in the ear; excessive and continued scratching; redness; swelling; crusts or scabs on inside of the outer ear; hair loss around the ear.

TEETH

Dental disease can result in bad breath, painful chewing, and tooth loss. Bacteria under the gum can travel to the heart, kidneys, and liver.

While brushing your dog's teeth, check their mouth for signs of oral decay. Bad breath is an obvious sign, but other's you should look for: reddened, bleeding or swollen gums; tarter build up; drooling; inability to eat comfortably; weight loss; fractured, discolored or missing teeth; swollen or misshapen jawline.

Besides brushing, you can help maintain your greyhound's teeth by using dental food, dental treats and dental chew toys.

EYES

You can check your greyhound's eyes by gently doing the following: Face your dog in a brightly lit area and look into his eyes. They should be clear and bright, and the area around the eyeball should be white. His pupils should be equal in size and there shouldn't be tearing, discharge or any crust in the corners of his eyes. With your thumb, gently roll down your dog's lower eyelid and look at the lining. It should be pink, not red or white.

Signs of an Eye Problem that should result in a vet visit: tearing; discharge; squinting; red eye; rubbing, pawing or scratching the eye; cloudy eye; color changes in the eye; loss of vision, usually evident when an animal appears clumsy or confused in low-light conditions

What is Pannus and are Greyhounds susceptible to this eye condition more than other dog breeds?

Pannus is an eye condition that involves the clear outer cornea of the eye. It is typically first discovered as a sort of cloudiness of the cornea, possibly with tears. Over a period of a few weeks this will progress until a thin web of blood vessels spreads inward toward the center of the cornea. If you let pannus progress beyond this point, then your greyhound could be seriously impaired.

NAILS

How to trim your dog's nails:

Aim for your dog's nails to be close to touching the ground, or just a bit higher. Always use a nail clipper designed for dogs. Human nail clippers don't work well, because dogs' nails aren't flat like ours.

Arrange yourself and your dog comfortably. Some dogs will sit right down in your lap for a nail trim. But you can also sit on the floor next to your pup during the procedure. Reassure your dog. Even if he doesn't seem nervous, talking to him in a soft, calm voice will help make nail trimming more pleasant for both of you.

Hold each paw as you work and spread the toes. Be careful to stay away from the quick, which is easier to cut into than you think. The quick is the end of the toe's blood vessel, so if you cut the quick, the toe will bleed.

Trim dewclaws. If your dog has dewclaws, which are remnants of fifth toes, you'll need to trim those too. Look for them high on the inside of each foot. Not all dogs have them; in many breeds, it is common for dewclaws to be removed shortly after birth.

Have styptic powder on hand in case you do catch the quick. Baking soda, baking flour, cornstarch and sugar can also stop bleeding.







So What Is "The Linda Loop"?



GFNJ President Linda Lyman recommends that all greyhound adopters hold their dog's leash in a way that we call "The Linda Loop". The result is where the leash is wrapped around your wrist and held so that it is more difficult for the leash to slip off your hand if your dog pulls. All new adopters are shown how to hold the leash this way. The Linda Loop has saved many greys from getting away from their owners—if you are not familiar with it, please go to the GFNJ website (gfnj.org), click on YouTube Videos and watch the video where adopter Jacqueline Howard and her foster boy Spiderman demonstrate how to do the Linda Loop.

Smelly Skunks Are Always in Season

Skunk odor removal is never easy and if you don't have a "skunk wash" product on hand, you can prep the solution below. If your dog is sprayed, keep your pup outside and check their eyes immediately; if they're irritated or red, flush them with cool, running water.

STEP 1: In a Bucket, Mix Together The Following:

- 1 quart of 3% hydrogen peroxide
- 1/4 cup baking soda
- 1 teaspoon liquid dishwashing soap

DO NOT STORE MIXTURE OR MAKE IT AHEAD OF , TIME, AS IT COULD EXPLODE IF LEFT IN A BOTTLE.

STEP 2: Clean and Rinse


With rubber gloves, apply the "skunk wash" and avoid getting the solution in pet's eyes or mouth. Vigorously rub the mixture through fur, but don't leave it on too long as peroxide can bleach fur and irritate skin. Rinse your dog thoroughly.

STEP 3: Finish With A Gentle Pet Shampoo

Lather your pup with a pet shampoo (or baby shampoo) and rinse completely. Thoroughly towel-dry your pup, and place them in a warm, sunny room for few hours so that they don't get chilled.
